



Planning a Trip to Safety City

Schools serving the residents of the City of Grande Prairie can choose from the following programs:

- **Street Smarts with Mud, Mammals & Machines**, Tuesday mornings, 9:30am – 11:30am.
- **Smoke & Sirens** on Tuesday afternoons, 12:30pm – 2:30pm
- **Barnyards and Boots** on Wednesdays – 9:30am – 11:30am **or** 12:30pm – 2:30pm

Schools serving residents of the County of Grande Prairie #1 or MD of Greenview can choose from the following programs:

- **Street Smarts with Barnyards and Boots**, Thursday mornings – 9:30am – 11:30am
- **Smoke & Sirens**, Thursday afternoons – 12:00pm – 2:00pm
- **Barnyards and Boots**, Wednesdays, 9:30am – 11:30am **or** 12:00pm – 2:00pm

Fees: \$3.00 per child. Invoices will be sent to schools based on the number of students registered for the program.

Teacher Responsibilities: Your visit is expected to be a fun learning experience. You can help us by:

- Filling out registration forms as fully as possible
- Contacting us with any questions you might have
- Bringing the required number of parent chaperones (Minimum of three per classroom)
- Ensuring that chaperones are aware that they will have an active role during Safety City programs
- Sending the parent letter home so that students can be prepared for their visit.
- Actively supporting Safety City programs while on site by participating and maintaining order with the students while they visit. Our guest presenters want to provide a great learning experience and this is achieved more effectively when students are behaving respectfully and appropriately.
- Be prepared and dressed for the day's weather forecast
- Wear close toed shoes.
- Let us know if any students can not be photographed when visiting Safety City. We do often take photos and short video clips of activities in Safety City.
- Optional: Have students wear name tags. This helps create a more personal program experience.

Chaperone Responsibilities: Safety City is a fun learning environment for children. In order to maintain safety, parent chaperones are essential.

- Please ensure that chaperones **DO NOT** bring younger/older children with them, which are not part of the registered class.
- Chaperones will be expected to actively assist with program components and with monitoring, supervising, and reinforcing safety rules as required, during all Safety City activities.
- Dress according to the needs of the day's weather forecast. Some portions of our programs are outdoors. Be prepared for the weather. Close toed shoes are recommended to prevent injuries.
- Have fun while helping the children learn.

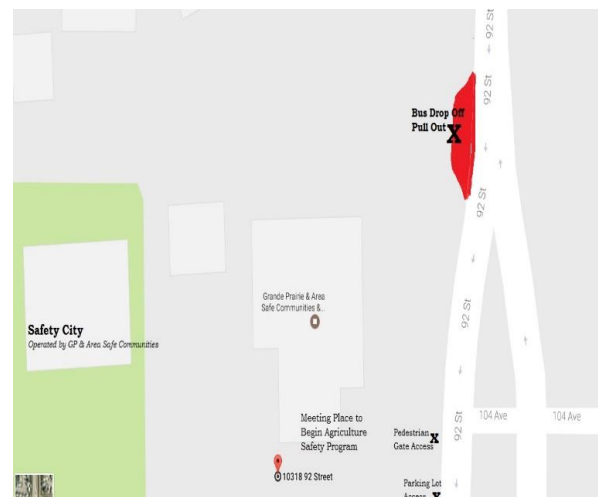
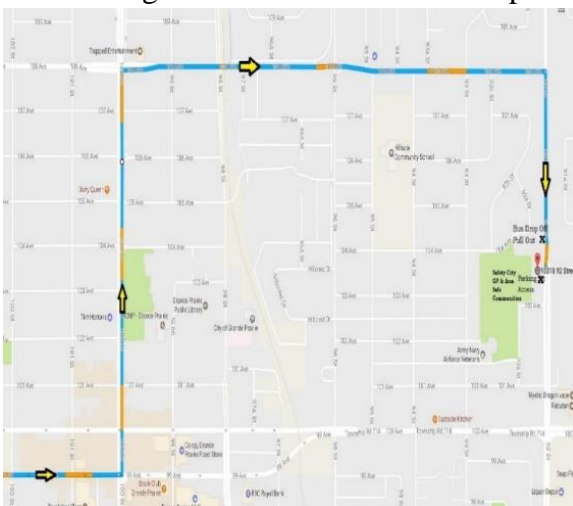
Student Responsibilities: Your visit is expected to be a fun learning experience. Students are required to follow appropriate rules of conduct as expected at school. Students are expected to follow safe practices during all activities. Please ask students to leave all electronic devices, including cell phones at school. Students are expected to follow the rules while in Safety City and be respectful to our presenters and staff. Students should wear closed toe shoes and be dressed prepared for the day's weather forecast. Portions of the program are outdoors.

Food: We do not supply food or beverages. Students are welcome to bring food with them. A snack may be enjoyed at our facility, if time permits. The main building does have a water fountain.

Dress Accordingly: All programs have some outdoor components. Please ensure children have appropriate clothing for the weather conditions forecasted. It is preferred that the children wear closed toed shoes (running shoes) to prevent injuries.

Cancellation Policy: Programs will run rain or shine. Some program elements may be modified to accommodate weather related issues if required, but whenever possible outdoor components will run as planned. As students will often still be walking or standing outside regardless of weather conditions, we do ask that children are dressed appropriately for the weather and for warmth. In the unlikely event that a cancellation is necessary due to circumstances beyond our control, we will make every effort to give as much notice to teachers as is possible.

Bus Information: Buses should use the bus pullout for dropping off and picking up students. This is located just before our building when heading southbound on 92 Street, just before reaching the 104 Avenue (Crystal Heights) intersection. The easiest way to accomplish this is to enter 92 street from 108 avenue heading southbound. Please see maps below for reference.
